## Notes from Your School Librarian "Review of Basics"

The Library ministry that I have pursued with our students has some basic elements that I review here. Principally, my promotion of their reading journey, during my mid-week presence, involves Library class visits for many; for Kinder it's in-class story reading; and, for all, it's drop-in during breaks. Know that one can borrow up to two books at a time, for a week, no charge. Also, FYI, "Yellow" labeled books, with a "P" designation are for the primary grades. "White" labeled books either have an "E" for the elementary grades or "FIC" for the upper grades. And the "Blue" are restricted to our Jr. High veteran readers. Additionally, as requested by faculty, we are working on identifying the Lexile rating of books to better accommodate borrowers' reading level. Know, however, that one's awareness of Library basics matters most when parents actively aid their students' reading pursuits, be that from apt book choices to the responsible return of overdue items.
